
Autism Awareness week.

The pupils and staff will be having a street party and singing songs from the war.


We are asking for a £1 donation for the Royal British Legion.

In our shape space and measure lessons we have been looking at data. Sorting items into groups, lists and tables.




We decorated Viking face biscuits and Viking Shields






Johnson Class >



completed a run/walk and all the money raised they donated to our school..



SPEECH AND LANGUAGE THERAPY STRATEGIES

BLANK'S LEVEL 3 - (RETELLING) - EASTER SEQUENCING ACTIVITY

This is a short Easter-themed activity to support an individual to work on their receptive language skills (understanding) at Blank's Level 3, focusing on sequencing skills! The aim is to put the pictures in the correct order. There are more than 6 so you'll have to consider the pictures you choose and the order for your story! Start with a 3-part story, and when they are confident with this, try the activity again this time using 4-6 pictures! Add challenge by asking them to tell the story about the chick once they have finished the sequence.



An individual has an understanding at Blank's level 3 when they are able to:

Follow a set of directions

Arrange pictures in a sequence

Tell a story or describe an event

Summarise a story in one sentence

Predict

Please see your child's Communication or Therapy profile for their Blank's level of understanding. If your child is working at Blank's level 1-2, you can model this activity and tell the tale of the chick to support their developing understanding.

During Art this half term we have been making our own Viking longships. We also had a visit to Jorvik Viking Centre in York to look at what life was like during Viking times.














Red Nose Day Friday 15th March







Students also enjoyed trips to Hepworth Gallery and Wentworth Garden Centre.


