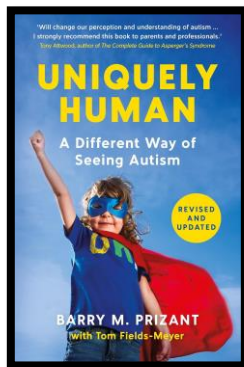


News from Radlett

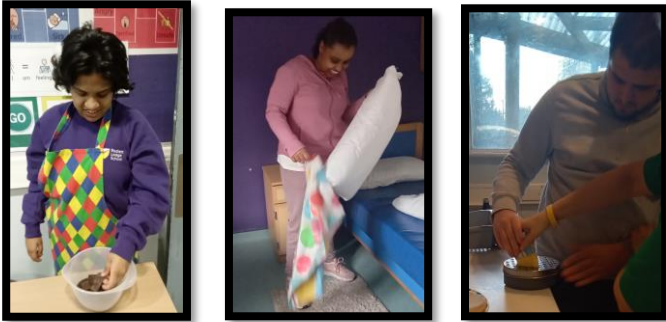

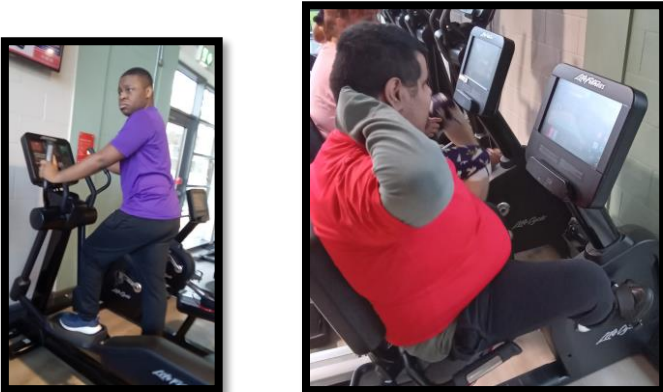

Spotlight on Jupiter class:

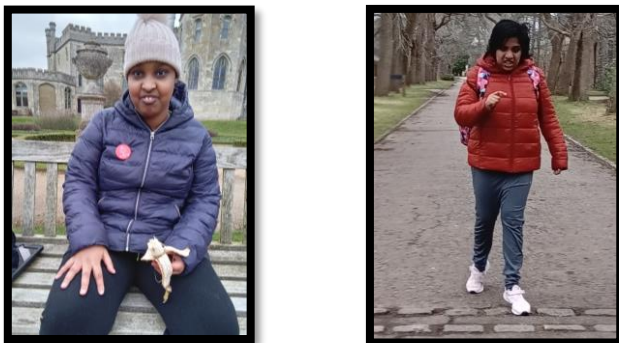
Jupiter class have been focusing on their independent living skills over the last term, from planting their own produce, shopping and cooking for their friends in class and finally household tasks.

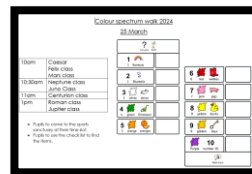
Top Tips:
