AUTUMN 2

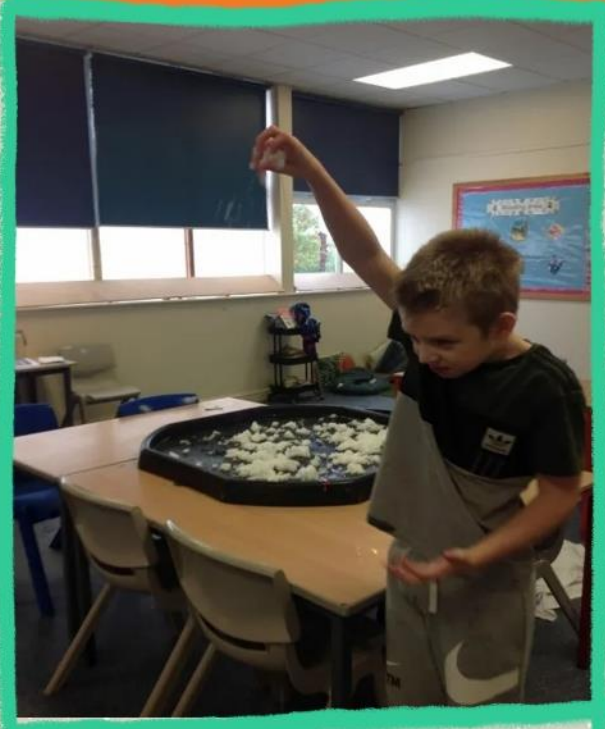

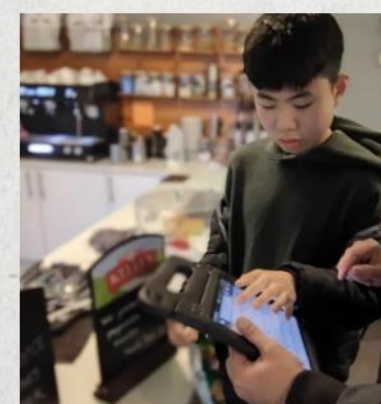

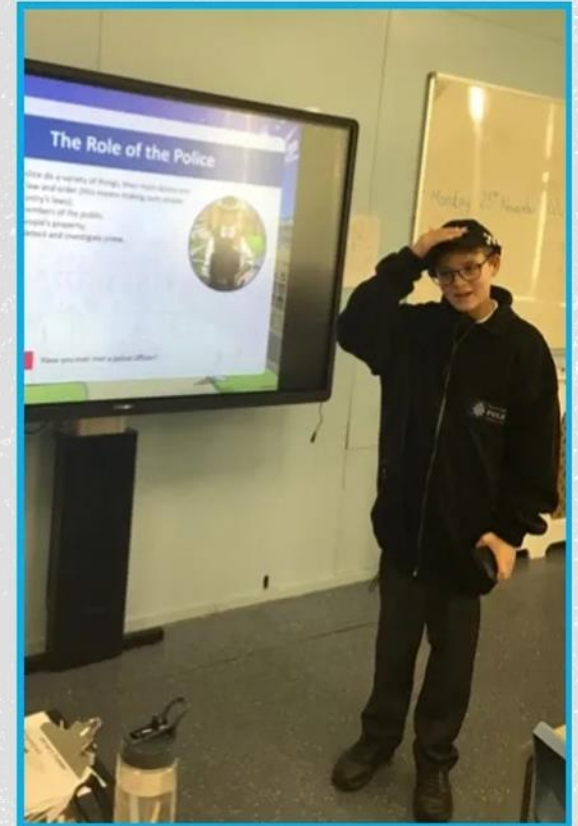

Class

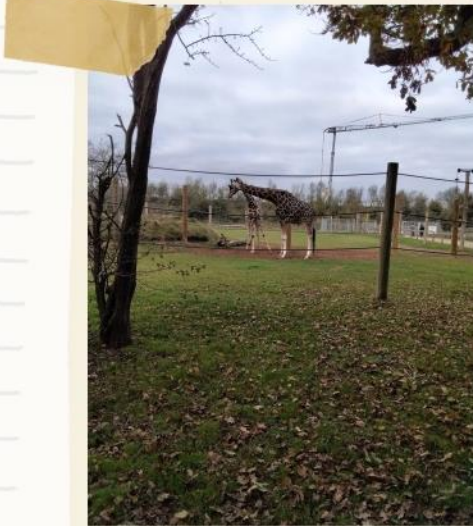

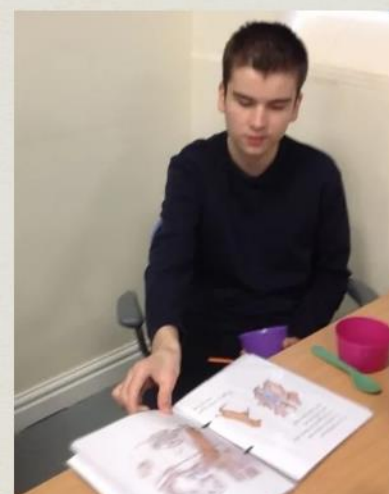


Reilly Class

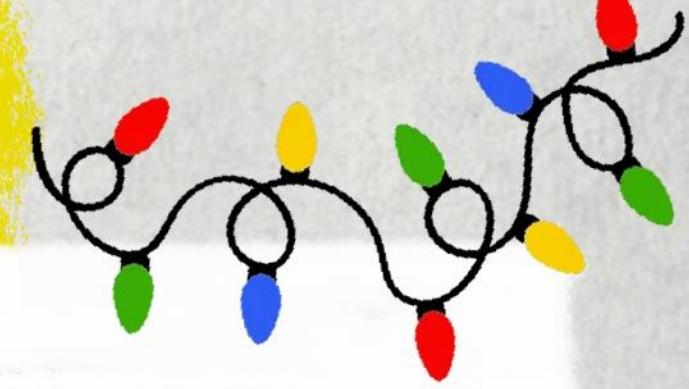
Wiggan...

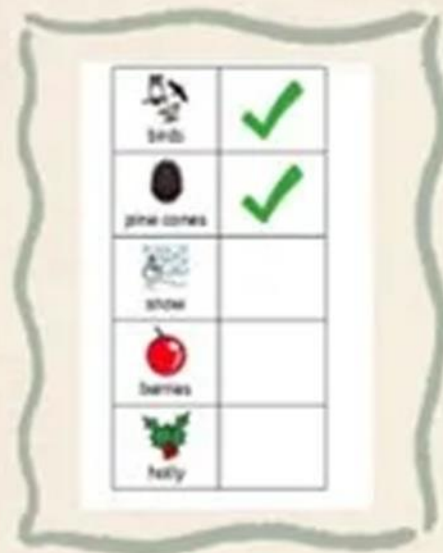


CHRISTMAS NATURE WALK

This is a Christmas-themed activity which gives individuals opportunity to engage in conversation skills and vocabulary building.

Additional benefits of this activity include opportunities for sensory exploration, understanding different textures, colours and smells.

This activity may also work as a movement break opportunity to support self-regulation in the busy holiday period.



1. Create a checklist of things you might see, touch or smell outside, such as birds, snow, trees, pinecones, leaves etc. This may also be in symbol/picture format.



2. Identify an area you could go on the nature walk, this could be in the garden, a park, or anywhere with nature around.



you will need:

- A small bag or basket for collecting items
- A visual checklist of item to find (e.g. pinecones, leaves, holly, berries).
- Optional: A camera or phone for taking photos



3. Introduce the checklist and activity - "Today we're going on a nature walk! Let's see what we can see." or show a correlating symbol/picture and label 'Nature walk'.

3. DURING THE WALK:



Encourage observation

- o "Can you hear the birds? (Show bird symbol) What do they sound like?"
- o "Look at the trees! (Show tree symbol) Do you see any Christmas colours?"

Label/Talk about the environment

As you find items, model language related to them:

- o "This is a pinecone! (Show pinecone symbol or photo) It's brown and crunchy."
- o "Wow, look at this holly! (Show holly symbol or photo) It's shiny and green."

Talk about plants and animals you see.

- "These leaves are falling! (Show leaf symbol) Why do you think that happens?"
- o "What animals live here? (Show animal symbol) Can you see any?"
 - o Symbols: Images of falling leaves and local wildlife.

Sensory exploration: touch and smell

- o "How does this pinecone feel? (Show hand symbol) Is it rough or smooth?"
- o "Let's smell these leaves! (Show nose symbol) What do they smell like?"
- o Symbols: Icons for hands, noses, and textures.

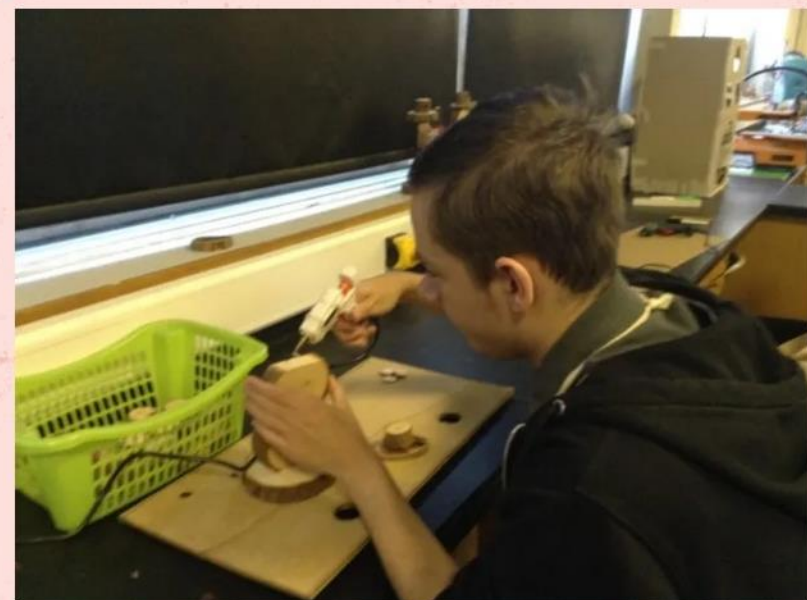

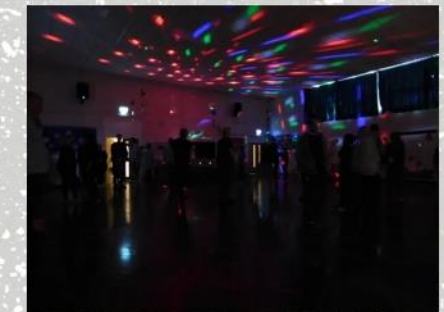
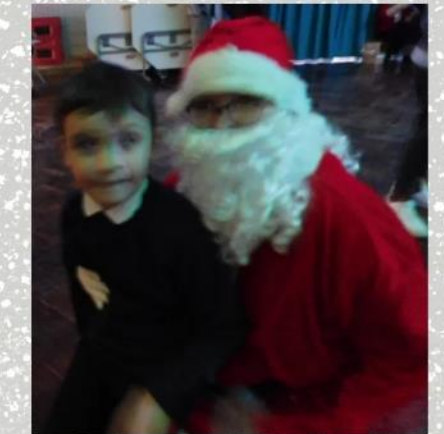
