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

We have had a great time learning about our local area and comparing it with other places. We have been practicing skills in rounders and getting very accurate with bowling and batting! The children had an amazing day trip to Magna where we learned about different elements and experimented with lots of interactive things.









During our school visit to the Holocaust museum as part of our History course, Oscar, George, Layni and Matthew explored powerful exhibits that told the stories of millions of people affected by the Holocaust. We saw photographs, personal belongings, and listened to survivor testimonies that helped us understand the human impact of this tragic period in History.

One of the most emotional parts of the visit was placing a rock at the memorial - a Jewish tradition to honour and remember those who have passed. Each of us placed our stone in silence, reflecting on the lives lost.

The experience was deeply meaningful and left us with a stronger understanding of the importance of tolerance, empathy, and remembering the past to help shape a better future.

Suggestions for self-regulation and co-regulation strategies for summer holidays from the school's Occupational Therapist's...





Emotional regulation isn't just about staying calm, it's about helping children feel safe, understood, and supported while navigating life's ups and downs. Here are some simple, effective strategies to create a more peaceful, predictable summer.

Create a Summer Schedule with Visual Supports

Even if summer is less structured than the school year, creating a predictable rhythm can reduce anxiety. Use a visual schedule to map out the day, including meals, playtime, rest, and outings. Autistic children often feel more in control when they can see what's coming next.

Build In Regulation Breaks Before They're Needed

One of the most effective ways to support emotional regulation is to be proactive, offering children space and tools to stay regulated before they become overwhelmed. Timetable symbols Brain Breaks



Plan for:

- Movement breaks (jumping, stretching, dancing).
- Quiet time in a cosy, sensoryfriendly space.
- Breathing or mindfulness activities (blowing bubbles, deep breaths, sensory jars).

These can be built into the daily routine, just like meals or playtime.



Prepare for Outings with a "Regulation Kit"

Outings to the park, attractions, or family gatherings are common in the summer, but they can be unpredictable and overstimulating. Prepare a small regulation kit to bring along, filled with sensory tools your child finds calming.

Ideas to include:

- · Noise-cancelling headphones.
- Chewy necklace or fidget toy.
- Sunglasses or a hat for light sensitivity.
- Comfort items (stuffed animal, photo, or calming scent). Giving your child access to these tools can help them self-regulate on the go.

Practice Co-Regulation Daily

Children develop emotional regulation through their relationships.

Co-regulation—the process of soothing and supporting children through emotional experiences—is a vital step in helping them build the skills they need to self-regulate over time.

That might look like:


- Sitting close and breathing together.
- Naming and validating your child's emotions ("You look frustrated. I'm here.").
- Staying calm even when your child is upset.
 As you co-regulate, your child feels safe and understood, and over time, they internalize these calming strategies.

And ... Celebrate Small Wins

Every child's regulation journey is unique. Some days may be smooth, others more challenging. Celebrate small successes such as your child asking for a break, trying a new tool, or recovering more quickly from a meltdown.



Acknowledging these moments helps build confidence and reinforces the skills you're nurturing.



The event was a true team effort, and the positive feedback from families was heart warming. We wish them all the very best as they take their next steps.










Bell Class has had a fantastic Summer 2 term.




Barrett & Mckinley Class
















From the moment the performance began, our students were captivated by the colourful set, lively characters, and imaginative storytelling.

The videos are effective because the first-person viewpoint is easier for children to copy than traditional demonstrations performed by someone sitting opposite or to the side.

The videos target a wide variety of skills from tying shoes laces and fastenings on clothing to opening a pack of Dairylea dunkers!!





Alongside the videos, instructions to encourage children to either watch and copy, or watch while imagining the feeling of the movements and copy are provided, alongside some 'top tips' to master each skill."

The final score 4-3 Well done to everyone who took part.







































