All of our young people are autistic. They may behave in ways that you find unusual. If you are concerned about behaviour please discuss this with a member of staff, do not deal with it yourself.

See the manager or DSL if you have any concerns or questions. We work in a transparent way and always welcome comments or suggestions about how we can improve.



# Fire and Evacuation Procedures



We have established evacuation systems and trained Fire Marshals on both our sites.

All visitors must sign in and out at Reception upon entering and leaving the building. All visitors must be accompanied whilst on site.

#### On hearing the fire alarm

- All visitors, staff, children and young people must respond to a fire alarm; whether real, false or a drill.
- Keep calm and do not run. Leave by the nearest exit. Staff will supervise the evacuation of school to the designated assembly point.
- Once at the assembly point speak to a member of staff so they can report that you are safe.
- Do not return to the building until instructed to do so.

#### Discovering a fire

- Sound the fire alarm by breaking the glass at the nearest call point.
- Evacuate the building from the nearest exit.
- Speak to a member of staff who will direct you to the Fire marshal in order to report the fire and its location.
