

Enrichment

Enrichment sessions are group learning activities and clubs set up for pupils to enable them to socialise outside of their own class groups to experience, participate and interact with others. Enrichment aims to develop and reinforce social, communication and life skills across all developmental stages within school. Each department (primary, secondary, post-16 and HUBS) organises suitable activities for their students at least twice each week before the end of the school day.

Enrichment clubs include a broad range of activities to support a pupil's different needs and abilities These currently include:

Sensory

Sensory play, sensory movement room

Primary

Outdoor play, story massage, construction, arts and crafts

Secondary/P16/HUBS

Pool, table tennis, football and video games.

German, construction, pottery, horticulture, cool club, film, quiz, board games

Through these activities students further develop their fine and gross motor skills and peer friendships. Some pupils play football matches against other special needs schools at a local level.
