Why do we teach it?

At Helen Allison School we teach Art and Design because we want the students to be the best they can be, by providing opportunities and experiences that allow our students to take part in the Arts Award. We teach Art and Design to offer a variety of different creative opportunities which promotes self-esteem. Through the arts our students can express themselves creatively in a personalised way, and the curriculum encourages students to problem solve - becoming more aware of the process of learning through the making of mistakes. The curriculum widens student's perspective around the arts and the importance of art and design in the world they live in.

INTENT - What we are teaching

At Helen Allison School our intent is to offer motivating and engaging lessons incorporating opportunities throughout the year to experience different art forms.

- Exposure to different forms of art through external visits to museums, art galleries, theatre and participation in creative practitioner workshops
- Introduction to different artists from different cultures around the world
- Introduction to different techniques and processes
- For students to be able to achieve and make progress based on their interests and levels
- Preparing students for onward progression
- Raising student's awareness of what art is and how it relates to the world around them
- Introduce students to the History of Art placing art in context
- Development of personal skills and knowledge
- Development of self-reflection

IMPLEMENTATION - How we teach it


- Progression Map followed by all tutors for students to have access to different art forms throughout the year
