


News from Radlett

The class then had their chance to demonstrate their own artistic flair by creating their own unique Pop Art posters.






At the end of the lesson the pupils self assessed their learning. They were able to use the visual to let the teacher know whether they felt confident with their learning or needed more help.














Makaton:
