Thank you for your continued support and commitment to our school community. Together, we can make a positive impact on the lives of our pupils.


















#### Mackintosh Class

This term Mackintosh class have been developing our fine and gross motor skills whilst out in the community and in school!































## Clay Class

This half term, Clay Class have been doing subtraction in Maths, they have been brilliant at it.








# Bell class


To support our PSHE learning of 'right and wrong choices' we have been looking at ways we can improve our clasroom and the wider school with litter picking and recycling bins.

This half term in Cumming class we have been exploring capacity through the use of words full and empty and attempting activities linked to this topic.






In science, the class is learning about properties of different materials. This has led to experiments testing the absorbency, elasticity, texture and reflective abilities of physical matters we might find in life


#### Barrett Glass
