


News from Radlett

Spotlight on Juno Class:

This term Juno class have been learning about different bodies of water. From rivers and lakes to streams and the sea.

We took a drive out in the community and looked at rivers, streams and even came across a ford.



Understanding our senses has been another topic and in Literacy we have focused on descriptive language to describe all our senses, both at school and in the community.





Finally, in "My World" we have begun looking at the water cycle, focussing on where our water that we drink comes from. We are learning new vocabulary and meanings for this topic, such as precipitation and evaporation, breaking them down into syllables and clapping the beats of the words.

We will be creating our own model water cycles, to better understand the process in a hands-on way!



Our Focus of the Month: Low Arousal

The Low Arousal Approach focuses on the reduction of stress, fear and frustration.

By using these strategies, we all can learn to spot the signs of escalating anxiety and stress and defuse them in a calm nonconfrontational way.



Top Tips:

- **Adapt** the environment to meet the person's sensory needs.
- Consider your impact on the person's arousal levels.
- Consider how you dress and communicate
- Adjust your approach
- Reflect and learn
