Visit to the British Museum	link	Free	Prepare children by discussing exhibits they might see. Use the visit to connect classroom learning with real-world artifacts.
Natural History Museum: Space Exhibition	link	Paid	Explore interactive exhibits. Encourage children to engage in related science activities post-visit.

Science Museum Early Birds	<u>link</u>	Free	Interactive session for children with SEND. Reinforce scientific curiosity.
Walk in Hyde Park	<u>link</u>	Free	Identify flora and fauna. Reflect on sensory experiences.
Discover Children's Story Centre	<u>link</u>	Paid	Attend storytelling sessions. Encourage related creative activities.
Southbank Centre's Multitudes Festival	link	Free / Paid	Celebrate diversity through workshops. Create home art inspired by experiences.
LEGO Store, Leicester Square	link	Free	Promote creativity and motor skills through building challenges.
Free Drawing Classes at The National Gallery	link	Free	Enhance creativity and expression. Discuss art together.
Picnic at Holland Park	link	Free	Prepare meals together and enjoy Kyoto Garden. Discuss nature and culture.
Visit to the Victoria and Albert Museum	link	Free	Link exhibitions to classroom topics.
