

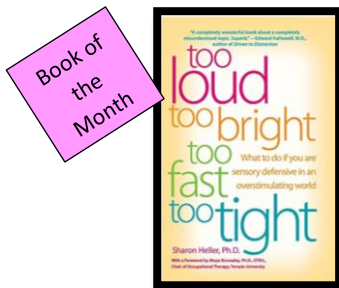
## News from Radlett

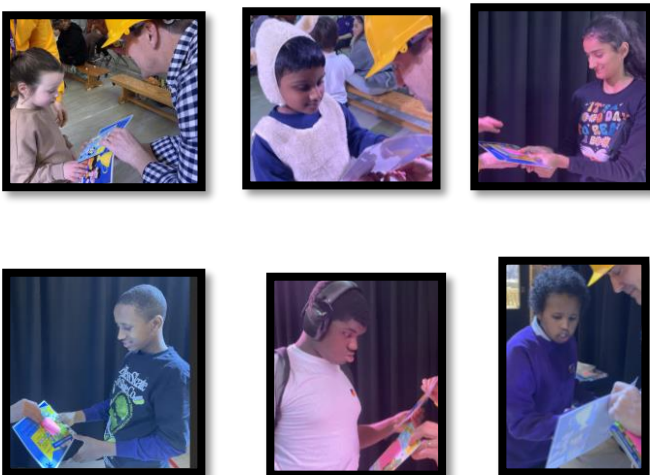


**World Book Day:**

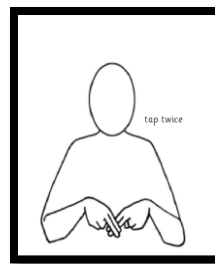

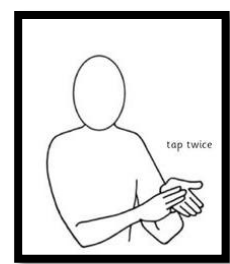
